Author unknown, "Still, Still, Still" is based on an Austrian carol. It is one of those that touches my heart and transports me to a place of quiet rest. Yet I have often wondered at our representations of the Christmas event as a peaceful; a 'silent night.' Is it only our romanticizing of an event far less simple and assuring? Surely there would have been no shortage of anxiety, pain, and concern. There *is*, after all, the circumstance of the birth; the questions on the lips of those around the 'blessed event.' The unknown future.

Perhaps the anxiety is the very reason our hearts are quieted and we hold dearly to the images of a still, still, still, silent night in this little town of Bethlehem. We, who live with the anxieties and fears of the world, know the need of a young, poor mother to lose herself in the soft skin, the needful suckling, the newly seeing eyes of her infant. We know that when she held her precious child, everything else faded away. Here was Hope. Here was Peace. Here was Joy. Here was Love.

We need to sink our hearts into gentleness and quiet, allowing everything else to fade away, if only for a little while. We need to allow the time and heart-space to receive the gift of the birth of God's Peace, God's Hope in our lives. We need to touch life and experience awe. We need to pause to look into the eyes of Love. We need to be aware of the Joy given to us.

This Advent, we are creating times for quiet. On Tuesdays, Dec  $10^{\rm th}$  and  $17^{\rm th}$  our sanctuary will be open from 6-8 pm with quiet music and candlelight for anyone to drop in for a time of contemplation or simply to relax – a respite from the busy-ness. On Wednesday, Dec. 18, we will offer Advent Prayer and Vespers from 7-8 pm. Let the Holy fill your heart.

# Listening with Our Hearts / Compassionate Listening for Reconciliation

# Skills for Reconciling Individuals and Communities in Pain and Conflict

One of the priorities we identified this fall is to work more effectively to be a healing community in the midst of racism in our neighborhood and community. One of the ways we do this is by continuing to build honest, rich, real inter-racial relationships within the congregation, working on our own racism and awareness of what it means to build and sustain relationship. As we deepen our sense of community, we are able to be a witness and healing presence for others in our wider community and world.

An essential skill that a few of us have begun to work on is *Compassionate Listening*. As we commit to become Compassionate Listeners, we learn to listen and speak from the heart. We learn to pay attention to the things that 'trigger' and upset us, and to bring ourselves back to our heart when we might react in destructive ways or run away from the situation. We learn to step outside the destructive triangle of Victim-Persecutor-Rescuer. We learn to 'sit in the fire' with each other and with those as yet unknown to us who long to be heard. It is a lifelong journey; a challenge of faith and a deepening of our intention to live as a community of healing.

A Compassionate Listening Practice Group, rooted in the The Compassionate Listening Project, will begin again in January. The Compassionate Listening Project trains people in many areas of the world to bring healing to their communities and reconciliation across wide chasms by learning to truly listen to one another's stories. This process is used in Israel/Palestine, in Germany, in Guatemala. It has been used in Harlan County, Kentucky in a conflict over toxic waste, in Louisiana in a community that had voted for a Nazi and a Klansman, and in North Carolina to facilitate dialogue on religious intolerance towards gay and lesbian people. It has been used in Georgia to help African-American organizers reduce racial conflict and citizen apathy that was hurting campaigns for clean water, literacy, and health services. A parallel program is used in facilitating healing relationship in the conflict in Northern Ireland.

Compassionate Listening is about transforming ourselves and therefore changing our world.

We hope you will want to become a Compassionate Listener in your own life and in the wider community.

Our January meeting will be Thursday, January 16, 6:30 - 8:30 pm. Will you make a once a month commitment to become a part of a CL community? Come with an open heart!
