





Worship on the Lawn

Sunday, June 12th was the hottest morning of the year to that point – in the 90's, yet we were scheduled to worship on the Lawn and then have a picnic. Not to be daunted by the heat, folks just kept coming – including some visitors from the neighborhood. We hauled out old Chautauqua hand-fans, and took advantage of the shade of the beautiful old trees on the church property.



A canopy over the communion table provided shade also for our worship leaders.

It was a fun service, singing familiar church camp hymns, and reflecting on God's Spirit blowing in our midst; and what it means to get a "second wind" when we are running a race and feel that we have no more energy or breath; when we are weary or discouraged. We talked about the second wind for the church, using the ancient image of the Church as a ship. There just happened to be a gentle breeze that day.!

A "Second Wind" was the theme for our Pentecost Offering, which supports congregational transformation, renewal and new congregation planting. (Most congregations held this focus in May on the Sundays around Pentecost. We moved it to June this year.)

On the previous Sunday, June 5, we had gathered before worship to make Origami Boats. On this hot day, we filled a pool for our worship on the lawn, and kids and adults had a great time floating our boats and experimenting with different ways to bring a 'second wind". Some blew with our breath; others used hand fans; and one deacon had even brought a battery powered fan for kids to use, which created some speed boating in that kiddie pool!

Thanks to all who helped to make it a special day by coming early to set up, filling a pool, setting up cold drinks to keep us hydrated, preparing and bringing picnic lunches, and just taking on the heat for a life-giving day of worship and picnic!
