Last fall, our Board of Ministry began praying about our need as a congregation to engage in a new level of study and exploration of our life as a community of Christ. Who are we in this neighborhood, this city, this world? Who are we as a congregation together? A number of us have expressed a desire to dive deep, to commit to each other and to God in a new way. Kathy Mead said the other night that we "have to fill our cups if we are to have life to give."

So we are inviting each and every member and friend of the congregation into a 2013 focus on "BECOMING THE COMMUNITY OF JESUS. Our hope is that every person in the congregation will dive in to Study, Pray, Explore, Share Faith, and Engage in Mission. We are planning a series of opportunities that will build on each other from January through June (and beyond!). In retreat together we will seek a sense of what God is doing in each of us and within us together for the world!

I encourage and invite you to pray about your participation in any and all of this immersion in the person and community of Jesus. I am excited about growth in personal faith and in community life and ministry. You will see a more complete outline of the plan on page 4 of this newsletter. BECOMING THE COMMUNITY OF JESUS

PART 1 "SAVING JESUS Redux"
