




I had just left the church where the elders had

We went running up to find a young woman, our neighbor, who was home alone in a second floor apartment with no access to a first floor, much less a basement. She was looking for shelter ... and company. She called her husband and said "I'm at Jacque and Dave's." Soon he arrived home from work and he, too, came over. Long after the storm had passed, the four of us sat just talking – and watching the news reports of damage in areas around us. In fact we talked for a couple of hours. About work, about his classes at the community college, her life as a librarian, about family, about movies, just stuff. They, in their 20's, we in our .... well older.

Sometimes good things blow in with storms and we are reminded of life and neighbors and all that is good – for which we are thankful! Let it be so ...



On February 29, 2012, two windows of our steeple were damaged in a windstorm. We received an insurance settlement for \$10,270 to repair them. The difference between the insurance check and the actual cost of replacing all four windows and sides of the steeple was \$15,400. The work has now been completed!! Financial Goal: \$15,400 is the amount we need to pay for the repair!

We made the decision and blessed these on Palm Sunday and they were there by Easter.

Dave Boger, who had spent a weekend last Fall at that church for Children, Worship, and Wonder Training, made and sent all the wooden and cloth pieces for the Easter CW&W story. (The story with the Tomb and the Stone that rolls away and the women who went to the tomb, the angel who proclaims the Risen Christ – that Charlsi told in our sanctuary worship on Easter Day here.) We received a lovely note from the Associate Pastor of the Owensboro congregation, indicating what a joy it was to open the box, find the story, and be able to tell it with their children on Easter Sunday.
