



I have a dream that one day every valley shall be exalted, and every hill and mountain shall be made low, the rough places will be made plain, and the crooked places will be made straight, and the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all flesh shall see it together.

This is our hope. This is the faith that I will go back to the South with. With this faith we will be able to hew out of the mountain of despair a stone of hope. With this faith we will be able to transform the jangling discords of our nation into a beautiful symphony of brotherhood. With this faith we will be able to work together, to pray together, to struggle together, to go to jail together, to stand up for freedom together, knowing that we will be free one day. And this will be the day, this will be the day when all of God's children will be able to sing with new meaning, "My country 'tis of thee, sweet land of liberty, of thee I sing. Land where my fathers died, land of the Pilgrim's pride, from every mountainside, let freedom ring!" And if America is to be a great nation, this must become true.

Six Weeks of Compassion!

Each year we celebrate and give to **Week of Compassion** which is our Disciples of Christ Relief and Development ministry working in crisis situations throughout the world. Our work is extensive, deep, and ongoing in cooperation with Church World Service and with ecumenical and interfaith partners in every place. When tornadoes, hurricanes, or floods devastate communities in Joplin, MO, or Moore, OK, or Japan or Africa or Latin America, *we are there*. When war destroys communities



and lives, we are there. We always say that "Week of Compassion" is more than a "week"; it is year 'round Compassion with a week of special emphasis for our giving. THIS year, we had a Summer Mission focus called "Six Weeks of Compassion" which extend from July 28 through September 1.

In addition to the WOC Offering, we responded to WOC's call for needed **Emergency Clean-Up Buckets** for Church World Service (CWS) and we gathered Paper Product Packs for distribution through the Festival of Sharing in Missouri this fall. **What a wonderful response during this time!**

Once again our Outreach and Stewardship Ministry Group is providing us with WEEK OF COMPASSION UPDATES to help us follow our year-round Disaster, Relief, and Development ministries throughout the world. Next to the library doors see the new **Week of Compassion World Map** with our mission responses marked with map-pins. The RED PINS mark places of Emergency Disaster response. The YELLOW PINS mark the places of ongoing recovery and development. The list of places and projects is located next to the map.

The 2013 RECONCILIATION OFFERING will be received on September 29th and October 6th. The Special Offering is used to fund our Church's mission priority to become an pro-reconciling/anti-racist church through experiential education, inclusive worship and intentional dialogue across racial/ethnic difference. Funds from this offering are providing for leadership development in our camps, our communities and our congregations as well as providing resources to promote small group study and community-action. Your giving is changing lives and building hope for realm of God for our children and for Christ's Church! WE STILL HAVE A DREAM! AND WE HAVE THE COURAGE TO LOVE BOLDLY!

In July, when our Christian Church (Disciple of Christ) General Assembly gathered in Orlando, one of the resolutions accepted and approved by the Assembly was this resolution helping to move us as a denomination deeper in our embodiment of God's Grace and Welcome to all. As an Open and Affirming congregation, we have studied human sexuality and our faith. We already welcome and celebrate the gifts of lesbian and gay people in our midst and in our ministry. Yet we are always seeking ways to live our faith more deeply and more compassionately. Thanks be to God for this movement forward by the General Assembly! How might this resolution encourage us to express our oneness more fully?

GA-1327 (Sense-of-the-Assembly)

BECOMING A PEOPLE OF GRACE AND WELCOME TO ALL

WHEREAS, "We are Disciples of Christ, a movement for wholeness in a fragmented world," called to welcome others as we have been welcomed by God1 and to practice hospitality to one another,2 as well as to strangers;3 and WHEREAS, Scripture affirms that all people are created in the image of God and share with all others in the worth that comes from being unique individuals;4 and

WHEREAS, Scripture affirms that as Christians we are many members, but are one body in Christ each with different gifts, called by Jesus to love our neighbors as ourselves,5 and called to the ministry of reconciliation and wholeness within the world and within the church; and

WHEREAS, Disciples historically affirm baptism as the primary call to ministry and offer baptism to all who profess their faith in Jesus Christ as Savior; and

WHEREAS, Disciples historically profess that the nature of Christian discipleship is profoundly informed by the Lord's table, which is central to the act of worship, calling attention to the radical hospitality extended by Jesus, who welcomes all to the table of grace; and

WHEREAS, the Disciples' movement came to be in reaction to limitations being placed on this welcome, recognizing that excluding anyone from the Lord's table fragments the body of Christ; and

WHEREAS, the 1997 General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) called for the church to give continuing research and reflection "concerning the participation of gay and lesbian persons in the full life and ministry of the Church";6 and

WHEREAS, persons continue to be devalued and discriminated against within society and more sadly, within the church because of their sexual orientation and or gender identity; and

WHEREAS, Disciples find identity at the Lord's table, sharing as the body of Christ, valuing each other in covenantal relationship even when we disagree; and

WHEREAS, Disciples historically affirm that individuals and congregations hold differing interpretations of scripture, but that all are called to transcend differences and claim one another in Christian unity;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the General Assembly meeting in Orlando, Florida, July 13-17, 2013, calls upon the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) to recognize itself as striving to become a people of grace and welcome to all God's children though differing in race, gender, age, sexual orientation, gender identity, nationality, ethnicity, marital status, physical or mental ability, political stance or theological perspective; and **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the General Assembly calls upon the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) to affirm the faith, baptism and spiritual gifts of all Christians regardless of their sexual orientation or gender identity, and that neither is grounds for exclusion from fellowship or service within the church, but we celebrate that all are part of God's good creation; and

FINALLY, BE IT RESOLVED that the General Assembly calls upon all expressions of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), as a people of grace and welcome, to acknowledge their support for the welcome of and hospitality to all.
