As I write, it is January 6, the Day of Epiphany - the day we celebrate God revealed in Jesus to <u>everyone!</u> The story of the Magi, the Wise Ones, the Astrologers who came from the East to find and worship the child is the story that tells us that God came not for one group of people but for All people!

The other vital piece is the matter of what it means for God to be revealed or manifest in Jesus. On this Epiphany, I am drawn once again to Edward Scribner Ames who described it so beautifully. Ames spoke of the "Christlikeness of God." Ames wrote:

The whole discussion about the divinity of Christ is usually vitiated by the fallacy of assuming certainty with reference to God, and then arguing whether Christ is of the same nature, whereas all we can legitimately do is to begin with a warm, blood-red spirit of Jesus Christ and ask ourselves whether the heart of God is like that. The significant thing finally is not so much whether Christ is divine, as whether God is Christ-like! And the only way to determine this is by asking whether Christ is an exception or a normal product in the life of the world. If other lives like his are possible; if the social order is capable of incarnating his spirit; if a Kingdom of Christ-like men and women can be built in the world; then we may believe that the heart of the world beats true to the heart of Christ and that God --- the inmost Soul of all --- is like the soul of Christ.

Ames goes on to say that people do not doubt the goodness of Jesus the Christ. What people tend to doubt is whether Jesus' way of life and his values can or should be realized in our world. Is Jesus love, compassion, forgiveness, and unselfishness the way of life for which we long? Is the way of Jesus the way God leads us? It has been interesting to hear the recent outcry as Pope Francis calls the Church to live more closely the way of Jesus. Many Christians object! In this Epiphany season may we come to know the God revealed in Jesus and may we listen to the call of such a God!
