We speak often of this congregation as a community of prayer. Over time, open prayer has become a cherished part of worship here. What once may have felt uncomfortable or risky, has grown into communal prayer-life that is sacred.

There is nothing more deeply at the heart of our faith and ministry than prayer. Hardly a day goes by without someone asking me to pray for him or her, or that I do not promise to pray for someone in particular. I know that is true of many of you also. Always I pray for individuals and families who are going through difficult times whether they know it or

I am always deeply moved when someone we do not know calls and leaves a message on the church answering machine requesting prayer. In those moments I am awed by the reality that these persons believe and *trust* that we will pray for them; that we are truly a community praying for the world!

Watching the news is an exercise in prayer for the world. Driving is an exercise in prayer. Years ago when serving for a year as a hospital chaplain in the neurological ICU, I found myself praying for everyone I saw on a motorcycle. Keeping up with folks on Facebook and other social media can hardly be done without prayer. At every turn, the condition of God's people and God's world is placed before us.

We don't say "we'll pray for you" as a way of avoiding the Jesus-work of physical care, support, and advocacy. Rather our every action is born out of prayer and calls us back into prayer. I have found that though I name particular names and hold particular faces in the light of God, I also need to pray a simple prayer nightly. Increasingly, my favorite, my "go to" is:

Keep watch, dear Lord, with those who work, or watch, or weep this night, and give your angels charge over those who sleep. Tend the sick, Lord Christ: give rest to the weary, bless the dying, soothe the suffering, pity the afflicted, shield the joyous, all for your love's sake.

Amen. (The Book of Common Prayer)

May we continue to grow as a community of prayer; a community praying for the world.

A New Approach to Cleaning the Church

One of the difficult decisions the Board made in the Budget process was to end the employment of our church custodian, Raymond Sutton. This decision was made with prayerful consideration as the Board weighed the congregational priorities developed this past fall with the funds available through our pledges and gifts, rental income, and other fund raising sources.

With Dennis James taking the lead in volunteering time to clean the church, we believe that members of the congregation will join in this effort. We cannot always give financially in the ways we would like; yet there are ways we can give that help the congregation to have the resources to live out our ministry and mission priorities. Cleaning and care of the building is a part of this stewardship as well as a part of the ministry of hospitality.

This building is not just a building; rather it is the space in which the church worships, nurtures children, youth, and adults, lives out mission through Isaiah 58 Ministries, provides space for Bible study and prayer, a place of welcome and sanctuary for those seeking a safe space in community. It is a work of hospitality to prepare this welcoming place each week, and to maintain the building through the year.

Dennis James is committing time weekly to doing basic cleaning. Darrell Hughes and Stanley Williams have volunteered to keep the 2nd floor classrooms and restrooms clean. We have put up a sign up sheet on the Church Library door.
