A Community of Prayer and Presence for Peace & Justice

Our community and nation have been awakened since August by people of courage and faith who are saying 'No more inequity in the legal system, no more racial injustice, no more brutality.' There have been widely peaceful demonstrations by people of all races calling for an end to systemic racism.

The Church of many denominations has taken a strong and vital role in seeking to bring a peaceful presence and to de-escalate violence while calling clearly for change.

This congregation made the courageous and deeply faithful decision to actively strive to proclaim the call to justice and to work to make the protests in our community peaceful. We offered "Safe Space" for people in the community to come for prayer, conversation, counsel, and to help. We served as a space for those who wanted to protest to learn to do so peacefully and with purpose. We welcomed SLU and Wash U. students, those who trained to serve as legal observers, and those who cooked for protest groups. We helped protesters connect in constructive ways so that they would not connect with fringe groups. Greatly due to the involvement of the churches here in our community our area of the city has had predominantly peaceful demonstrations. Churches open in our area in

addition to CHCC have been St. John's Episcopal, South City Presbyterian, St. Margaret of Scotland, and the Word at Shaw. We are sick that there were still opportunistic groups that betrayed the protest by breaking the windows of some of our businesses. Yet we are glad that the organization by MCU, MORE, and the churches helped to avoid the violence that took place in Ferguson and to support non-violent demonstration and call for justice. Every person who helped this to happen seems to have been deeply moved by God's Spirit in this time.
