Winter Reflections Winter presents me with a paradox – startling beauty and discomfort. There is much that I love about winter. Driving along I-270 coming back from BJC-West this morning were breathtaking ice formations -frozen water that had been flowing down the rock through which the road was cut. I could hardly keep my eyes on the road, they were so amazing. I was reminded of walking out on the ice formations on Lake Michigan when I was serving the church in South Bend. And that took my mind to cross country skiing through the woods and even just through Tower Grove Park on a beautiful winters day. And then, of course, there are the eagles off the river bluffs in the coldest of January as you drive down the Great River Road on the Illinois side. And everywhere we look the twisting and sweeping forms of bare deciduous trees against the winter sky. There is truly nothing like winter for stark, breathtaking beauty.

And yet ... I don't like being cold, and some days I just cannot get warm. Like many, I get that chilled to the bone feeling and just want to bundle up, nestle in and stay there. I am always concerned for those who do not have places that are warm enough, and those who are ill and don't do well in the cold. Many of our seniors are endangered in the brutal cold. Accidents on ice take lives.

So what of this paradox? Some move to warmer climes. Some stay and hibernate for the winter. I hope to continue to push the edges – to live as fully as possible in every climate. If in a blizzard, I want to touch the beauty, feel the snow on my tongue and at least at moments experience the breath-taking cold. If in a warm climate I want to wade in the water - as we did in the Bay of Bengal three November's ago in India. All to say - that I want to feel and experience what God provides. I want to be alive and filled with the awareness of the moment given to me. May we as the Church in every climate, be aware of what it means for us to be alive and attentive to God in the world! We are not to wait for another season in order to be the Church. THIS is the season, the time and the place, now and always, for us to fully embody God's love! Come on – let's teach somebody how to build a snowperson! It'll be fun! - Jacque

# Winter Outreach – Blankets Needed

Tree of Warmth for Winter Cold

#### WINTER OUTREACH

We can hardly function when the temperature drops into the single digits. Those of us with heated homes, cars, warm clothes and beds with blankets find ourselves chilled and avoid going out. We take extra care – as well we should! So what must it be like on the streets when it is below 20 degrees?

"Winter Outreach" is an organization of people whose goal is very simply to keep people from dying in the cold. When the temperature drops below 20 degrees, volunteers go out to find those who are on the streets. Transportation is offered to take those who will go to a shelter for the night. For those who will not go, warm blankets, extra socks, and simple food are provided. The goal is very simply to keep each one from freezing to death overnight. Still we know that people die in the extreme cold.

If you have a warm blanket to give, you are invited to bring it to the church. (Mokabe's Coffee House is the collection center near us. We will take them there, or you may take them yourself if you choose. The brutal cold has already hit and Winter Outreach is in full swing. If you would like to volunteer with Winter Outreach, we can connect you.

#### WINTER WELL-BEING CHECKS

Those who live on the streets are not the only ones in need of extra care in the winter. As temperatures dive, many in their own homes may not have enough heat. Some may be okay at home, but getting out in the cold can be dangerous to our health. Some may have treacherous steps and ice is danger. Someone who is "in for the winter" may become ill and need help but feel hesitant to let anyone know. Exertion in the severe cold to shovel or sweep can be dangerous. Please make the winter a time to reconnect and remain connected to neighbors, friends, and acquaintances! Relationship is a life-giving and life-saving gift of winter!

**Community Book and Article Discussion Group** – Out of recent conversations among neighborhood folks, a discussion group is arising to meet monthly to discuss racial and other issues of diversity in our neighborhood through books and articles shared. A wonderful young woman, Brittanie, is initiating this and Pastor Jacque has offered to help. If you would like to participate, watch for further information as we get started!! On the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesdays of the month, Board, Ministry Groups, or Elders will begin at 7 pm, following "**Wspr**."

We hope you will plan to add this special hour in the middle of your week to connect with your community, God, and yourself!
