We Are One: Six Weeks of Compassion 2014

Last year's response to our first summer combined outreach project for Week of Compassion, Church World Service, Isaiah 58 Ministries and Missouri Festival of Sharing was so outstanding, we have decided to do it again. From August 3 through September 7, we will emphasize giving beyond our own congregation through the projects listed below. Beginning on July 27, we will distribute lists of items to bring. On August 3, we will distribute the 4-week sharing calendars and coin boxes for Week of Compassion. We will receive any and all gifts you want to bring any Sunday between August 3 and September 7, and on September 14 during our Stewardship moment we will dedicate all of the offerings given. Here are our 2014 projects:

Week of Compassion: our goal is to give \$1200 or more. Coin boxes, cash in the special envelopes in the bulletin each week, and checks are very welcome.

Isaiah 58: Brenda Booth says the items that often run short are Peanut Butter and Toilet Paper. So, PB and TP it will be, in addition to anything you regularly give using the Meal a Month plan. We will pass the PB and TP on to the food pantry every week but keep count of the contribution on a poster for everyone to see.

Church World Service <u>always</u> needs school and health kits and clean up buckets. After some thought, we decided to collect items for health kits this year, since we have not done them for a few years. You can bring any of the following items on the 6 Sundays to a table in the hallway, and on Sept. 7 we will assemble the kits. Or you can bring one or more assembled kits if you prefer. Items:

1 hand towel 16"x28" (no fingertip or bath towels)
1 washcloth

- l wide-tooth comb (remove packaging)
- 6 standard size Band-Aids
- l toothbrush (in original packaging)
- l bar of soap (bath size, in wrapper)

l metal nail clipper (no metal files or emery boards, remove packaging)

If assembling a kit yourself, place all items in a one-gallon plastic bag with zipper closure. Remove excess air from bag and seal leaving only $\frac{1}{2}$ " open. Do not include toothpaste—it will be added to kits prior to shipping them to where they will be used.

If you prefer not to bring items, cash is welcome for completing partial kits, and for shipping them.

Festival of Sharing—various kits are collected for distribution in Missouri to various anti-poverty agencies and institutions. Last year we collected paper goods. This year we are collecting **student dental packs**. Items:

4 child size toothbrushes, soft 2 adult soft toothbrushes 1 fluoride toothpaste, 6 oz or more 1 dental floss—any size

If assembling a kit yourself, place all items in a 1-gallon zip lock bag.

Finally, as school items go on sale this month, please think about picking up some of the following items that we can take to the Regional Assembly on October 12, where those attending will assemble and pack School Kits for Church World Service: blunt children's scissors, 12-inch ruler, new pencils with erasers, box of 24 crayons, large eraser, hand-held pencil sharpener, spiral notebooks of around 70 sheets each.

Quadrennial Brought Change to Atlanta

"What do we want? Break the chains! When do we want it? Now!" The 2014 Quadrennial of Disciples Women has made an impact on "Quadrennial City" a.k.a. Atlanta. More than 350 women marched in the streets to demonstrate against human trafficking. More than 1,100 women gathered in the Marriott Marquis to listen, learn, reconnect, revive and make a joyful noise unto the Lord. (For photos, quotes from speakers and more, "like" the Quadrennial Facebook page.)

The walk against trafficking raised just over \$6,400 for <u>youthSpark</u>, an Atlanta organization that works against human trafficking. But those were not the only dollars raised to make an impact on the community. The Masks for a Cause project had 37 entries and the voting (with dollars) on the masks netted more than \$1,000 for the <u>Wellspring</u> Living Program that provides trauma therapy to women who have been sexually abused.

All this was in addition to the 400+ books, 650 pieces of underwear, 550 pairs of socks, 840 hygiene items taken to the women and children at the City of Refuge mission and the 2,200 pairs of eyeglasses donated to the Lions Club. (And it doesn't even count the Blessing Box offerings that were approaching \$9,000 at last count.)

During Friday's plenary session, the leadership announced a continued emphasis on human trafficking for the next four years with the introduction of a new webpage <u>Breaking</u> <u>the Chains: Link by Link</u> that will be populated with resources on the issue. The resources will be focused on three areas of trafficking: sex trafficking, labor/immigration trafficking and demand.
