On May 6, our Board of Ministry had a wonderful conversation about what 'community' means in our life as church. The reflections and observations said something powerful about who this congregation is becoming. Here are some comments from the heart of the discussion:

'Over these months since last August, we have changed because we have been willing to step into the change in our wider community.' We have changed both individually and as a congregation. We have changed in our relationship to our neighborhood, our city, our ecumenical/interfaith community. One person noted that her concept of community has changed. Another noted that "when we look for the connections, it's amazing how easily we can find them – when we look" Another spoke of community as "tackling things together." Yet another said that "it is about 'hospitality' – hospitality is a gift and we need to continue to look for ways to live it out." Several noted that becoming "Safe Space" changed us: "It's good for us to have the doors taken off the building and the doors taken off our minds." In sharing the vision that we only move forward and grow stronger from here, one person said: "If you're a person of conscience, you can't close your eyes again." As I walked of this precious gathering, I knew that God's Spirit is living and breathing in the ministry of this community of the Beloved. Our identity statement as Disciples of Christ says that we are "a movement for wholeness in a fragmented world and that as a part of the one



PENTECOST SUNDAY - May 24th

Pentecost, the 50th day after Easter, is celebrated in the Church remembering God's Spirit breathing, blowing, coming as if "tongues of fire" and God's people speaking, listening to, and understanding each other across the barriers that separated them. This was the Church of Jesus the Christ coming into being!

On Pentecost Sunday we celebrate that power of God bringing God's people together to live as those moved by God's Spirit in the world. You are invited to wear Red on Pentecost. On that Sunday, we have created the practice of having the whole congregation together in worship so that the Children, Worship and Wonder story is told in the sanctuary.

The items produced at the assembly will be primarily scarves. The completed items will be used by a new church start - Fringe Community - for their Warmth in Winter ministry. The majority will be given to the Open Shelter in downtown Columbus.


