If you're here, it can't be all bad!

As I write, we have just heard news of the death of Mohammed Ali. Ali, the great, long time, heavyweight championship boxer and Olympic champion, is perhaps even better known for his greatness as a human being. He stood and spoke as a witness to God's care for every person, for those who were poor and saw no future. He spoke boldly and clearly for civil rights. He fought literally and figuratively not for himself but to be a voice of hope and justice in the world as a servant of God. In an interview on NPR, a black man from a poor part of LA remembers Ali coming to his neighborhood, to his gym. He said they were without hope, but when Ali came there, this young man thought

"Well if he's here, it can't be all bad."

Tragically Ali also fought a long battle with Parkinson's disease, and has unfortunately been among the many who have taught us something about the price of repeated head injury in sports. He died at age 74.

There is something about the deaths of public figures such as Ali that knocks us for a loop? It is not simply that they are known my many; it is not simply, in this case, that a famous sports figure has died. It is that this person has held a collective hope for God's people. It is about the meaning of his or her life and the world's loss at their death.

Perhaps we see ourselves in this

Person and are reminded that our lives are created to embody hope for others.

I cannot seem to let go of the man's response to Ali's presence in his neighborhood: "If he's here, it can't be all bad." Isn't that how we are called to be present in places in need of hope? As followers of Jesus the Christ, we are called to go where God's people need to know that they are worthy; where people need to be encouraged and lifted up. Sometimes we are the ones who need to be lifted up, and it is in going to others that we find our hope. Ours is a faith of incarnation, of the embodiment of God's love for all. Make it such that where you go, people say that if YOU are there, it can't be all bad. You come as a witness to God in that place! Jacque
