## A word from a Co-Treasurer:

Compton Heights Christian Church is a special place for me. If family and friends are my first home, then Compton is my second. I find community here. I find people who think about important issues and talk about important issues and pray about important issues and act on important issues. I find God here.

Compton operates at a deficit. In our budget for 2016 we estimate that deficit will be $\$ 14,125$. We began 2016 with about $\$ 19,000$ in savings to cover this deficit.

If you are feeling a little whiplash after reading the first two paragraphs of this article, bear with me; I think I can pull them together. As a member of the church, when I think about Compton I think about how I am spiritually nourished by the people and ministry that make up Compton Heights Christian Church. As one of the co-treasurers of the church, I see the day-to-day financial support needed to sustain that ministry.

Summer is coming - vacations, graduations, weddings, weekend trips, longer days, the call of the outdoors - so many things that can pull us away from regular attendance. Historically, when attendance decreases, so does giving. Regular giving helps us sustain the ministry of the church without dipping into our savings before it becomes necessary. Every week we list "Happy Friday" in our church calendar. And every Friday (unless severe weather), a deeply committed group of Compton Heights folks gathers at the church at 7:00 am to make "Happy Friday" happen. Kathy Mead, Madeline Haraway, Arlene Arbogast, Darrell Hughes, Walt Tarde, and the Kreugers have been the core H.F. group with a number of others joining in at times. (YOU are always welcome and invited!) It is really a simple, fun, and spiritually nurturing act.

The group sets up a table out in front of the church with coffee, hot chocolate, (and sometimes cold water in the summer). Armed with big HAPPY FRIDAY signs, smiles, and waves - the group very simply greets people who are driving or walking/getting off the bus as they head to work or school. Some are just out for their morning run. We offer coffee, conversation, or just a wave!

Over the years we have gotten to know people in the community and to care and pray for people we only see on Fridays! Relationships are built. Our experience is that people come to know the unconditional love of God through the simple care offered. There have been some folks who have come to worship to find out who these 'Happy Friday' people are! When they arrive on Sunday, they meet all of us!

Our goal, however, is not to get people to come to church. Our goal is to leave these walls - offer joy, fun, encouragement at the end of a work week, or the beginning of a work weekend. Our goal is to be the people of God in the community.

From $3^{\text {rd }}$ grade through High School, children are in age groups and in Cabins together with counselors - just like in single age group camps. Children under $3^{\text {rd }}$ grade are in cottages with their parents/grandparents.

Adults who come without children are in cabin together and have an Adult group.
Fee per person $\$ 210$ (by May 2), \$230 (after May 2)), fee per person with 3+ in family \$190. Camp Scholarships are available for all applicants. To receive scholarship you must apply by the May 2 deadline.
