### "Stay Woke" by Jacque Foster



On the first Sunday of Advent, we hear the words of Jesus to his disciples, "Keep awake" - be ready, watch because we do not know how and when Christ comes. He says "if the owner of the house had known when the thief was coming, he would have 'stayed awake' and not let his house be broken into."

It is significant that this image of the coming of the Christ is spoken of with examples of scary times and threatening events, such as Noah being swept away in a flood, and a homeowner not knowing when a thief would break in.

Life-shaking events wake us up. It may be when we truly see poverty as we had not seen it before. Or when we experience loss or violation, and suddenly we see. When our eyes are really opened, we cannot 'unsee' what we have seen or 'unknow' what we now know. We cannot go

back to who we were before we were awake. (no matter how we may wish it!)

On the other hand human beings are pretty good at denial and refusing to see what is in front of us. Those who suffer in our world call us to wake up and "Stay Woke!"

- 'stay woke' to the systems that maintain poverty
- -'stay woke' to systemic racism and white supremacy -'stay woke' to the real
- devastation and spiritual injury of war
- -'stay woke' to the insidious rape culture.

Because *only* when we are awake to what is broken, awake to evil, are we awake to the God of justice who comes to bring wholeness and life in Jesus the Christ.

This is the critical essence of Advent – God is coming into our midst in times and ways we would never expect. When we see danger and recognize oppression, God meets us there. As hard as it is, "Wake up and 'stay woke!' It is in the world's deepest need, in places we would never expect that we see God coming! Christ is coming now! This is the Good News, the Gospel.

### 2017 People to People Pilgrimage to India

Six members of Compton Heights Christian Church — along with two from Indiana and one from Texas - will make a People to People trip to India from January 4 to January 20, 2017! Compton Heights CC participants are: Monte Abbott, Brenda Booth, Jacque Foster, Joan James, Leslie Latham, and Marsha McGuire.



### Our itinerary includes:

- Time with Global Mission Partners in Chennai
- 5 days at Family Village Farm & Kings Matriculation School to include Medical Screenings for 500 700 children and adults. (We will have 3 RNs in our group, coordinating this aspect.)
- Visits to nearby Christian Medical College in Vellore, the Schieffelin Institute of Health Research and Training at Karigiri, one of three major medical centers in the world focusing on leprosy.
  - Shanthigramam home for elders who have been cured of leprosy (yet cannot return to their villages or families), worship at St. John's Church (Ft. Vellore), time in the community in Vellore.
- Travel to Madurai where we will stay at Tamil Nadu Theological Seminary learning about education for ministry in that area, and engaging with Global Mission partners and ministries with Dalit people (those out–caste below the caste system. in Madurai we will visit a Hindu Temple first built about 600 CE.
  - Time back in Chennai, concluding with retreat.
- We also hope to visit the Roman Catholic Order the Sisters of the Good Shepherd in Chennai. This is the order that Monte Abbott works with here in St. Louis.
  - Our group will share gifts of financial support for many of the ministries we visit.
  - Each participant pays for his or her own trip expenses. In addition, each congregation represented on this trip is encouraged to provide \$1000 to be divided among our mission partners.

Leslie Latham's family congregation in Savannah, MO has made a contribution of \$250 to our total. We hope to take another \$750 from Compton Heights CC.
